The data from 266 online student's surveys reinforced that a high percentage of students in LDRS 211 agreed (4 or 5 on five-point Likert scale) that their service experience successfully impacted strategic priority areas:

- The work I did met community needs (81.1% agreed, mean 4.14)
- I learned something by doing this service (78.6% agreed, mean 4.09)
- This helped me develop as a leader (74.7% agreed, mean 4.03)
- This changed one or more of my perceptions or beliefs (63.1% agreed, mean 3.79)
- This was a worthwhile use of my time (81.2% agreed, mean 4.13)
