## SHARE PROJECT: HEROISM THEMED OUTREACH IN TITLE I SCHOOLS

563 freshmen cadets, 91 sophomore cadet leaders, and 10 graduate students worked together to create: 480 Heroism Curriculum packets for 24 Title I schools, 1,204 Healthcare Hero Gift Bags, 753 Thank You Cards for local Heroes, and more than 50 videos about their personal heroes.

## KRAUSE LEADERSHIP CENTER SERVICE LEARNING TEAMS

401 sophomore cadets led by 48 trained sophomore leaders participated in direct service to 24 community partner agencies assisted by 2 alumni and 5 staff. In addition 6 Veteran Students engages in direct service. Together they impacted housing, food insecurity, support of veterans and families living in poverty, and safe and accessible environments.

## JUNIOR ETHICS ENRICHMENT EXPERIENCE

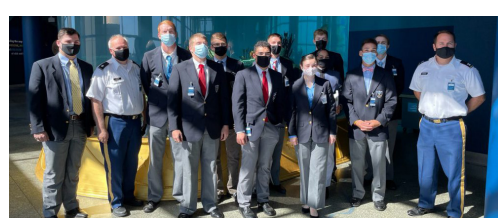
Junior cadets participated in the Junior Ethics Enrichment Experience (LDRS-311), which introduced a new curriculum called The Guardian Ethic based on Plato's Republic this year. The curriculum provided students with a practical framework for making ethical decisions and emphasized character development through Virtue Ethics. Norm Seabrooks, Class of 1973, the first African-American to play football for The Citadel Bulldogs and a member of The Citadel Athletics Hall of Fame, presented the keynote address.
