



LEADERSHIP DAY BY THE NUMBERS



SHARE PROJECT: HEROISM THEMED OUTREACH IN TITLE I SCHOOLS

654 freshman cadets, 151 sophomore cadet leaders, and 12 graduate students educated more than 4,000 K-5 students in 13 Charleston County School District schools about heroism and helped them create 570 thank-you cards for their heroes. 14 faculty and staff members assisted with the morning's bus launch, on site school coordination, sorting of the children's cards upon return and supply deconstruction.

KRAUSE LEADERSHIP CENTER SERVICE LEARNING TEAMS

431 sophomore cadets, led by 50 trained sophomore leaders, directly served 25 community partner agencies dealing with causes ranging from housing access and security to empowerment of people with disabilities. Additionally, a team of 9 Veteran students served at a Senior Living facility, Kempton. Their efforts were assisted by 1 Faculty member, 1 staff member, 6 alumni, and a MOH Recipient, Master Sergeant Leroy Petry.

JUNIOR ETHICS ENRICHMENT EXPERIENCE

Building on coursework from LDRS-371 and using the Markkula Center framework for ethical decision making, approximately 590 juniors participated in 28 Junior Ethics Enrichment Seminars. These seminars were hosted by partner organizations including Allegiance Flag Company, ASF Global, BMW, Chick-Fil-A, and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center. Cadets heard from industry and government leaders about difficult decision making in the professional world.



REFLECTION LEADERS (NON-CADET)

Sophomore cadets returning from service sites were greeted by reflection leaders including 1 veteran student, 3 graduate students, 3 outside community member, 12 faculty and staff members, and the Regimental Commander. Together, they reinforced the day's lessons and the role of service as leadership. Additionally, 19 faculty/staff and community members helped debrief the freshmen cadets upon their return to campus.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP INTEGRATION SEMINAR

Approximately 460 cadets participated in 24 Senior Leadership Integration seminars facilitated by Citadel faculty and a mentor from The Class of 1979. Partner organizations included Davis & Floyd, the FBI, City Police, the SC Stingrays, the International African American Museum, Cyber and Intelligence experts, and experts from many fields including accounting, medicine, technology, consumer products, entrepreneurship, and public service.
