



2022 LEADERSHIP DAY BY THE NUMBERS



SHARE PROJECT: HEROISM THEMED OUTREACH IN TITLE I SCHOOLS

682 freshman cadets, 153 sophomore cadet leaders, and 11 graduate students educated more than 5,800 K-5 students in 17 Charleston County School District schools about heroism and helped them create thank-you cards for their heroes. 17 faculty/staff members helped debrief the freshmen cadets upon their return to Citadel campus.

KRAUSE LEADERSHIP CENTER SERVICE LEARNING TEAMS

332 sophomore cadets, led by 48 trained sophomore leaders, directly served 23 community partner agencies dealing with causes ranging from food and housing security to empowerment of people with disabilities. Their efforts were assisted by 2 staff members, 6 alumni, and 11 veteran students.

JUNIOR ETHICS ENRICHMENT EXPERIENCE

Approximately 500 juniors continued using The Guardian Ethic curriculum based on Plato's Republic for JEEE this year. The curriculum provided students with a practical framework for making ethical decisions and emphasized character development through Virtue Ethics. Lou Holtz, legendary football coach and analyst (EPSN: 2004-2015), who fashioned a life that inspires everyone who hears him to a greater sense of purpose and the strength to fulfill it, presented the keynote address.



REFLECTION LEADERS (NON-CADET)

Sophomore cadets returning from service sites were greeted by reflection leaders including 1 veteran student, 1 graduate student, 2 alumni, 4 outside community members, 9 faculty members, 9 staff members, and Medal of Honor recipient Leroy Petry. Together, they reinforced the day's lessons and the role of service as leadership.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP INTEGRATION SEMINAR

Approximately 500 cadets participated in 28 Senior Leadership Integration seminar interviews facilitated by Citadel faculty, including a senior leader panel from The Class of 1979. Participating organizations included Boeing, County Sheriff and City Police, Cyber and Intelligence experts, and experts from many fields including accounting, medicine, technology, consumer products, writing, academia, entrepreneurship, and public service.
