



2023 LEADERSHIP DAY BY THE NUMBERS



SHARE PROJECT: HEROISM THEMED OUTREACH IN TITLE I SCHOOLS

650 freshman cadets, 136 sophomore cadet leaders, and 11 graduate students educated more than 6,000 K-5 students in 22 Charleston County School District schools about heroism and helped them create thank-you cards for their heroes. 19 faculty/staff and community members helped debrief the freshmen cadets upon their return to Citadel campus. Additionally, 8 faculty/staff members assisted with the morning's bus launch and sorting of the children's cards upon return.

KRAUSE LEADERSHIP CENTER SERVICE LEARNING TEAMS

465 sophomore cadets, led by 39 trained sophomore leaders, directly served 27 community partner agencies dealing with causes ranging from food and housing security to empowerment of people with disabilities. Their efforts were assisted by 4 faculty members, 4 staff members, 5 alumni, and 8 veteran students.

JUNIOR ETHICS ENRICHMENT EXPERIENCE

Building on coursework from LDRS-371 and using the Markkula Center framework for ethical decision making, approximately 500 juniors participated in 30 seminars hosted by external host organizations from Amazon to Chick-Fil-A. Cadets heard from industry and government leaders about difficult decision making in the professional world and completed an assessment to reinforce concepts related to ethical decision making.



REFLECTION LEADERS (NON-CADET)

Sophomore cadets returning from service sites were greeted by reflection leaders including 1 veteran student, 1 graduate student, 1 outside community member, 12 faculty members, 9 staff members, and 1 5th year cadet. Together, they reinforced the day's lessons and the role of service as leadership.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP INTEGRATION SEMINAR

Approximately 500 cadets participated in 25 Senior Leadership Integration seminar interviews facilitated by Citadel faculty, including a senior leader panel from The Class of 1979. Participating organizations included Boeing, County Sheriff and City Police, Cyber and Intelligence experts, and experts from many fields including accounting, medicine, technology, consumer products, writing, academia, entrepreneurship, and public service.
