SHARE PROJECT: HEROISM THEMED OUTREACH IN TITLE I SCHOOLS

694 freshmen cadets, 155 sophomore cadet leaders, and 18 graduate students educated more than 4,000 K-5 students in 18 Charleston County School District schools about heroism and helped them create X thank you cards for their heroes. 16 faculty and staff members assisted with the bus launch, on site coordination, hero card sorting and supply deconstruction.

KRAUSE LEADERSHIP CENTER SERVICE LEARNING TEAMS

435 cadets, led by 51 trained sophomore leaders, directly served 28 community partner agencies. Supporting causes ranging from animal care, environment and Senior Care to veterans, food access and empowerment of people with disabilities. Cadets were joined at their sites by 9 Class of '79 Alumni and 6 Faculty/Staff members. Additionally, 4 Veteran students served at Kempton, a senior living facility.

JUNIOR ETHICS ENRICHMENT EXPERIENCE

Building on coursework from LDRS-371 and using the Markkula Center framework for ethical decision making, approximately 554 juniors participated in 29 Junior Ethics Enrichment Seminars. These seminars were hosted by partner organizations including Allegiance Flag Company, ASF Global, Forvis Mazars, Arco Design, and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC). Cadets heard from industry and government leaders about difficult decision making in the professional world.
